

Public Works Committee Meeting Meetings

May 13, 2019, 4:00pm

Meeting called to order at 4:03 pm

Old Business –

Colony Subdivision –

- Final phasing reviewed
 - o Phase 1: Riverside, Park, Colony north of Eagle Pt Dr
 - o Phase 2: Eagle Pt Dr, and Forest
 - o Phase 3: Colony from Eagle Pt Rd to Eagle Pt Dr
 - o Combo discount to do all three together (most cost effective and timely approach)
 - o 2019 vs 2020 start will be in the bid form since we are late in the year to be bidding
 - o Advertise for bids beginning 06/24/19 with bid opening 07/12/19
- Final design changes
 - o Do not replace storm east of Colony on Riverside
 - o Mill/Fill Park with cosmetic curb work (approx.. 20%)
 - o Mill/Fill Eagle Pt with cosmetic curb work on south side, and new curb/storm on north (whichever side the storm sewer is on – MSG to review the plans)
 - o NWWSD water line work – MSG will review estimate - \$100 to \$140K
 - o Colony North – eliminate 4' widening, mill and fill most (10% full depth), and curb repair only (approx.. 50%)

Vineyard/Groce – current estimate is \$420K which includes 10% contingency; should not need to relocate power poles; plans early June, then start assessment process

Colony/Lime City/SR 65 roundabout – Stage 3 design to be completed in June; potentially more TMACOG dollars to get closer to an 80/20% project funding– RTID to review 5/20/19

Colony Road (Hillside to Eagle Point) – design/spec is complete, assessment process to begin, project must start by July 2020

Bacon Street Traffic Flow – committee discussed changing the first block of Bacon to one way south with only a right-hand turn (west bound) at the intersection of SR 65. This was being considered due to the new boulevard extension as part of the relocated high school traffic signal down to Osborn. Committee members requested drawings of the Rossford Schools proposed boulevard and roadway changes for review. Mr. Ciecka, as Safety Director, is going to recommend this change to Council.

New Business

Crossroads Storm Water Review – discussed the pond north of the Carpenters Union out at the Crossroads. The City acquired the pond years ago from the Union. There was an ongoing erosion issue along the south bank that the Union repaired a few years back so currently there are no issues. The pond is basically serving as a pond – former borrow pit. It is not a storm water retention pond. MSG is to review the previous study of the pond to ensure there is nothing the City should be considering to benefit drainage in the area.
