

**Public Works Committee Minutes**  
**Monday of June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2020, 9:00 am via ZOOM**  
**With continuation July 8<sup>th</sup> at 8:30 am**

**Committee – R. Ruse, R. Densic, Allyson Murray, T. Kolb, J. Staczek**

**Guests - Bob Williams (MSG), Andy Langenderfer (Tetra Tech)**

**Excused - Jerry Staczek (on the 29<sup>th</sup>)**

**Lime City/65 Roundabout** – scheduled to start July 13<sup>th</sup> with shutdown of intersection until Sept 10<sup>th</sup>.

- Railroad crossing will be done during the project [still need to confirm Schreier RR shutdown]
- NWWSD utility work wrapping up
- Project did not include paving between Lewis to RR so MSG pulling together cost to get this resurfaced and maximize ODOT, RTID, and OPWC dollars since the project came in under estimate

**School Projects –**

- No luck with school superintendent meeting yet to discuss emergency road paving at Glenwood and sidewalk work
- MSG has crafted a sketch of a 10' wide asphalt bikeway and submitted it to Collaborative to discuss

**Eagle Point Rd Paving/Restoration -**

- Paving the week of June 29<sup>th</sup>
- May need to do some undercutting of subbase near west end
- There are ROW issues at far west end that we have to work around
- No parking signage needs to get installed at the completion of the project

**South Colony Rd (Hillside to Eagle Pt) –**

- Paving week of June 29<sup>th</sup>
- Project has run smoothly

**NWWSD New Projects**

- Inflow & Infiltration [I & I] – no update other than some residents have received an I & I flier
- Tree Street water line projects moving along, no issues
- Lime City water line wrapping up but the City needs NW to improve pavement cut patches
- Emergency waterline replacement planned for Santus Dr

**Colony Subdivision**

- Paving scheduled for the week of June 29<sup>th</sup> and July 6<sup>th</sup>
- Punch list items will follow
- Street Lights will be addressed as part of the City's ongoing LED conversion
- No parking signage update [Colony from EP to Gate] to be installed by City

**Vineyard/Groce** – start July 23<sup>rd</sup>, four-week construction window

**Safety grant** – preliminary plans being submitted around July 1<sup>st</sup> to ODOT, followed by ODOT environmental investigation

**Deimling Road** – Bergman to do tar/chip by mid-July

**Public Works Update** – Wales Rd house demo by Rossford Fire Dept, once COVID issues subside

**Pavement management and capital projects** – MSG/City to get updated pavement management proposals so we can prepare a new five-year plan

**City Engineer RFQ** – City to review request for qualification packet and will discuss schedule for advertising it at the next meeting

**July 8<sup>th</sup> – continuation meeting 8:30am** – Scott Cabauatan from Republic joined the meeting and Victor Coleman from Edison

**South Colony** – curbing isn't aligned with Colony down the hill. Allyson will check with the MSG

**Street Light LED Conversion** – Victor from Edison joined the meeting to discuss schedule and replacement fixtures for the conversion of the second half of the City's street lights. Victor indicated that the plan is to replace all lights (the heads) and maintain light coverage of the area. Ordinance will be before Council Monday. The Comm also wanted to ensure that Edison's quote covered the lights in the Colony Association and Hidden Cove area which have different heads. Victor indicated it did. Edison has a light (head) that is similar in style to what is in the Colony. We will have a meeting in the field to review

the existing 100 yr old lights. Other than that, the project will start once lights get ordered (it takes several weeks for them to come in).

**City Trash Pick Up Service** – bid results attached:

- Republic low bidder [~\$250K], but 2-day pickup and recycling qualifications –There is an error in the bid entry, but a clarification was submitted by Republic. They indicated during the meeting that they bid two days to save cost. Their recycling bid was open ended, indicating they could change cost and schedule at any time. Per Scott, they were very concerned with the program and covering their costs.
- Klumm was 2<sup>nd</sup> low [~\$311K] – City verified that there were no minimum # of properties for yard waste and recycling pickups; and verified that new container could be delivered in time
- Committee felt Republic did not submit a bid meeting the requirements of the bid specs. Motion by Jerry/2<sup>nd</sup> by Bob, for Klumm to be awarded the trash pickup contract with the voluntary yard waste and recycling program costs to be billed to the property owners [direct billed by vendor]. Motion passed.
